Born on August 30, 1980, Travis Freeman grew up in Engadine, Michigan. Since the age of 8 broadcasting and communications has always been a passion, hosting his first radio show at the age of 14 at WMTU in Houghton, Michigan. Travis recalls his first



public speaking experience when he was invited to serve as Master of Ceremonies for a regional Boys Conference. The keynote speakers were Steve Mariucci and Tom Izzo. In high school Travis was elected Class President of the Engadine High School Class of 1999, to this day still coordinating events and communications for his class. He officially started his broadcast career in the summer of 1996 at WNBY co-hosting the Biggest Little Town Parade in Michigan, in Curtis, a broadcast event that's still his very favorite to cover to this day. In his early days of broadcasting he provided play-by-play coverage of high school sporting events. He'll

tell you his favorite sport to call is baseball. Since then he's covered every day-part at the radio station. In the summer of 1999 he took a break from WNBY and was hired by 106 KHQ in the Traverse City region and went to college

at North Central Michigan College in Petoskey. During Christmas of 1999 he was offered a full time job with F&W Broadcasting and went back to Newberry and was named Operations Manager for WNBY-AM & FM. In 2003 Sovereign Communications bought F&W Broadcasting and Travis was named Station Manager and the first employee of the company. Since then the company grew to 15 radio stations across the Upper Peninsula. Currently, Travis is host of the "Original Midday Program" from 10am until 3pm on the local county music station 1450 WNBY and host of the "Workday Wrap-up" on the Classic (Con't on Page 4)

His duties include managing digital and social media online marketing campaigns along with being the National Sales and Political Director along with managing the Concert Division for the radio station group. Travis has been co-host of the popular call in radio show “ WNBX Trading Post” since 1999 which was featured in USA Today across North America in 2012. Travis has also filed reports for ABC News and CNN. He also consults numerous out of market radio stations around the Midwest and the United States.

In the community, Travis served as President of the Newberry Chamber of Commerce, founding board member of the Helen Newberry Joy Hospital Foundation, Chairman of the Newberry Area Ambassadors, Head Coach for the Tahquamenon

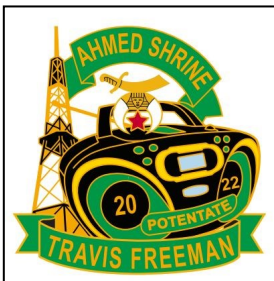

In December a Midwest Leadership Conference was held in Chicago for the several Boards of Governors of Shriners Children's - Chicago, St Louis, Twin Cities, Des Moines with Outreach Clinics in Omaha, Rapid City, Bismark, and future outreach clinics planned for Springfield, Missouri; Charleston and Salem, Illinois. Following are some of the topics that were discussed.

- We need to focus on what Shriners can do to support referrals and getting kids into the system.
- Direct referrals are a huge opportunity and we need to start accepting these patients.
- Should Shriners consider redefining what it means to be a Shriners patient?
- Celebrating the 100 year anniversary of Shriners Hospitals for Children needs to be a significant focal point for the organization
- How do we create a sense of belonging for Shriners in a future world where Shriners Children's will not be centered on brick and mortar?
- When will we get credit for the care we are providing in varied care models (outreach clinics, etc...)?
- Leadership needs to be more responsible and nimble with decision-making
- Licensing of physicians across state lines needs to be a focus - Development of the Shrine Physician Group is strategically critical for the

future.

The opportunity we all have is to help spread the word. Operationally we are enhancing a number of other opportunities. One of the biggest will be that of direct referrals for our ancillary support services. Initially this will be with Therapy but should soon include Imaging and Prosthetics and Orthot-

We are also improving our Outreach model of care to ensure we are optimizing our resources by sending the appropriate skill level and enhancing the use of technologies to better care for children remotely. Additionally, in 2022 we look to expand our network with additional partnerships in our markets. While many of these discussions are preliminary, these relationships and models of care are what will help ensure Shriners Children's establishes a foundation for the next 100 years.

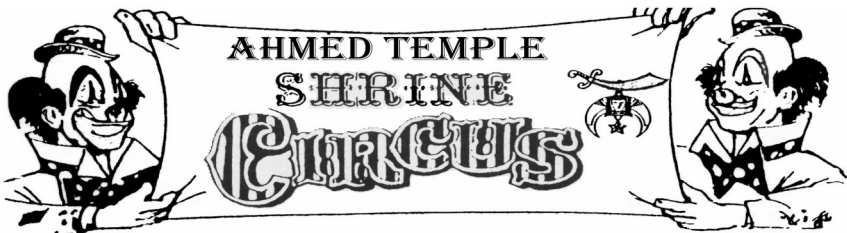

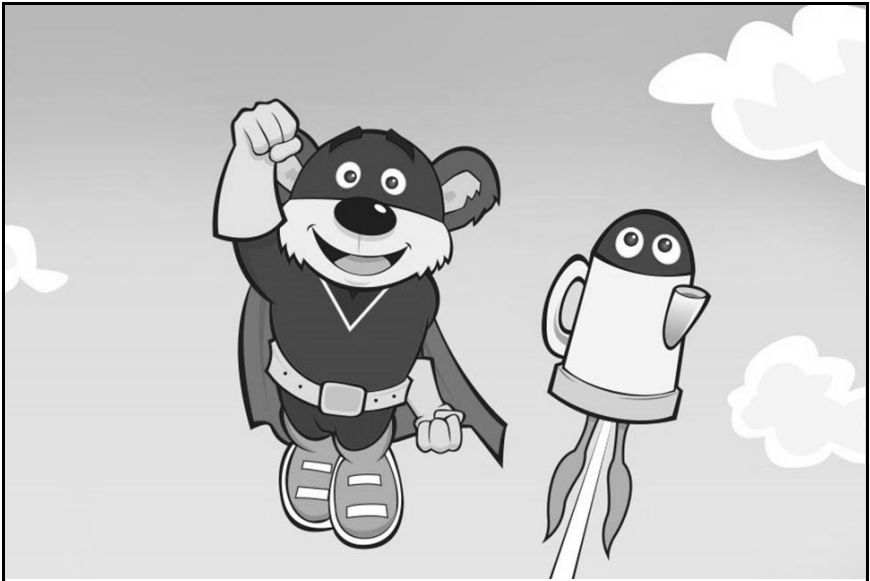
Join Ahmed Shriners attending MSA in Green Bay February 10-12, 2022

The 2022 Burn Awareness Week will take place Feb. 6-12. We are once again using the theme Be Burn Aware, and focusing on preventing burn injuries in the home, because the vast majority of preventable burn injuries continue to occur in residences. Homes are the sites of thousands of burn injuries to children every year, including scalds, fire-related injuries and electrical burns. Many of these incidents might have been easily prevented by following and implementing some basic safety tips.

The campaign features two child-friendly characters, Boots and Brewster – a caped, cuddly bear and a googly-eyed teapot – who are featured in activity books for children ages 3-7 and 8-12, available in English, Spanish and French. The entertaining duo leads children through the various rooms of a house, pointing out dangers, and sharing ways to easily correct or avoid them.

The coloring pages, word searches, cartoons and other activities are designed to grab children's attention and present the information in a memorable, age-appropriate manner. The campaign also includes various tip sheets and fact cards that emphasize the prevention of scalds, fire-related and electrical burns.

Shriners Hospitals for Children has also created an animated video, Boots and Brewster: The Burn Awareness Pair, which kids are sure to enjoy. In the video, Boots and Brewster take viewers on a fun and educational adventure to help them become more burn aware.
