Potentate James Corey Cain was born March 11th, 1981 in Quincy, IL. He graduated from Quincy Senior High School in 1999, Indian Hills Community College in 2003 and received his bachelor's degree in Corporate Financial Management from Northern Michigan University in 2005. Corey moved back to Iron Mountain to work as



an advertising sales consultant for Results Broadcasting. He and his family later moved to Houghton, where he was the accountant for Finandia University. In 2008 he again felt the draw back to Iron Mountain, where he took a position with E&E Furniture as a design and sales consultant until the spring of 2013 when he accepted a more exciting and lucrative career in the insurance industry. Corey accepted a position as agent with the Scott Sanders Agency, Farm Bureau Insurance of Michigan.

Corey was introduced to Masonry by Brother Russ Cram, and was raised September 11th, 2010 in Iron Mountain. In 2011, Corey's journey into Masonry also inspired his father Charles to be raised a Master Mason in August of 2016. Corey began his York Rite journey by joining the Royal Arch, Royal and Select Masons and Knights Templar. In April of 2014 he was invited to join the Upper Michigan York Rite College and

2016 he was invited to join the Red Cross of Constantine. In August of 2012 Corey took his first step into Shrinedom by joining The Ahmed Shriners. October of that same year Corey joined the Valley of Marquette Scottish Rite. Corey took another large step in Shrine by introducing us to another

new clown in Pappy's troop, "Crash the Clown" who landed safely for his first ever appearance at the Ahmed Shrine Circus in Iron Mountain. Corey has had the good fortune to serve as the Worshipful Master of the Iron Mountain Lodge in 2016, was named Mason of the year by the Iron Mountain Lodge in 2015, presided as the High Priest of Delta Chapter RAM, Governor of the Upper Peninsula York Rite College, and is currently the treasurer of Iron Mountain Lodge.

All of these accomplishments pail in comparison to his greatest accomplishment, his family. Corey is proudly married to Rachel (Burzik) of Lakewood, WI. They have three handsome sons, James (13), Samuel (2) and Henry (1). Corey is very proud of his family and thanks them everyday for their continued support and dedication, not only to him and their family but to Masonry and The Shrine.

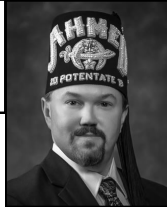

All you have to do is beat Noble Tony Giorgianni. Please congratulate Noble Tony Giorgianni on his election to the Oriental Guide.

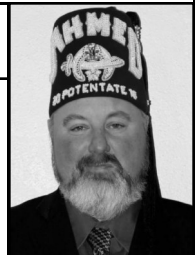

Sacramento Area firefighters took time out of their busy schedules to pay a special visit to a burn patient in the intensive care unit at Shriners Hospitals for Children.



Shortly before lunch on Tuesday, November 13, a hook-and-ladder truck from the Sacramento Fire Department pulled up on the X Street side of the Northern California Shriners Hospital and raised its ladder to a specially marked window on the fourth floor. A firefighter dressed in full gear scaled the ladder to wave through the window to a patient who has been recovering in the ICU for many weeks.

The surprise was an emotional moment and a bright spot for all involved – the patient, his mother, staff and the firefighters. It was a poignant reminder of how firefighters go out of their way to make a positive difference in the

lives of children recovering from burn injuries.

After hearing how much the young patient likes firefighters, retired firefighter Oscar Barrera worked with the Northern California Shriners Hospital nurses and social workers to coordinate the visit. He said the visit provided a “feel good” moment that stays with firefighters and bolsters them when they are responding to emergencies in the field.

“It’s wonderful to see we can make a difference for kids in the hospital,” Oscar said.

Niko King, deputy fire chief for the Sacramento Fire Department, echoed that same sentiment. “The pace of being a firefighter today in the City of Sacramento brings us to several emergencies a day. It isn’t very often where we can pause and connect with a person who has suffered a tragedy and is on their journey to recovery. To be able to visit for a moment, show off our fire truck, and put a smile on a kid’s face creates a memory that lasts longer than the lifetime of our careers,” he said.

The firefighters also visited kids in the play area on the second floor before jumping back on the truck and heading to their next call.
