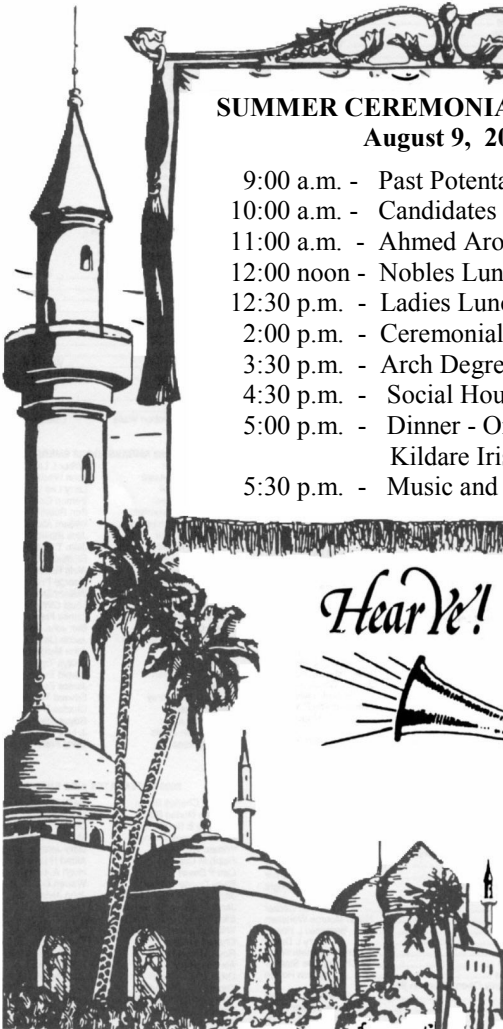

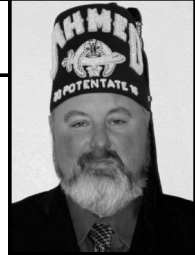

In the video on Imperial's website, Adrian Croissant III of Ainad Shriners in East St. Louis, Illinois,

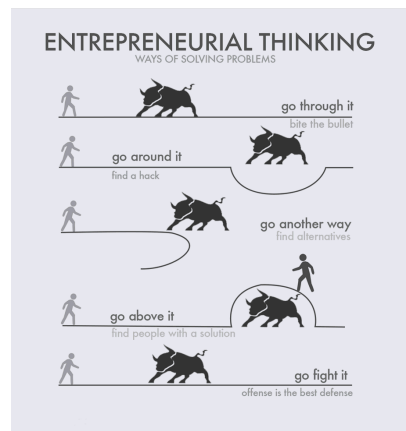

When Shriners International was first founded in 1872, the organization built on the Principles that guided Freemasonry, while adding an element of fun and ultimately, philanthropy, that set Shriners International apart. The two organizations are also structured similarly:

Shriners have temples; Masons have a Blue Lodge or Craft Lodge

Members of the Masonic Lodge are required to learn about their fraternity and earn a series of Masonic degrees. When a member has completed the third and final degree he becomes a Master Mason and is then eligible to become a Shriner.

Additional avenues of Masonic study are available – these are known as the Scottish Rite and the York Rite.

Bob Bouschor, Past Potentate Remembered

Bob, was born January 4, 1936, in Manistique, He was very proud of being a Mason. Bob was very committed to the Masonic Fraternity. His Masonic journey began in 1957, when he joined Lakeside Lodge #371 in Manistique. In 1961, he transferred his membership to Marquette Lodge #101. He soon joined the Scottish Rite, York Rite, Ahmed Shriners, and others, taking leadership positions in most of them. In the Scottish Rite Masons Valley of Marquette, Bob

was an active member especially the 4th and 32nd degrees. He was recently recognized as a 60 year member. The Supreme Council of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry's Northern Masonic Jurisdiction honored Bob in 1990, conferring to him the 33rd Degree, In the York Rite Masonic bodies, he was a Past High Priest of the Marquette Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, Past Thrice Illustrious Master of the Marquette Council of Royal and Select Masons, Past Eminent Commander of the Lake Superior Commandery of Knights Templar. Bob served as the Potentate of Ahmed Shriners in 1981. He later served as the Recorder for a number of years. Bob was instrumental in bringing the Shrine Circus to the Upper Peninsula, and worked diligently with the circus for many years. He also played in and served as the Director of the Ahmed Shriners Band for many years. Bob's dedication to the Shrine extended regionally and internationally. He served as the President of the Great Lakes Shrine Association in 1989, and brought its annual convention to Marquette that year. He was also granted Emeritus Representative status to the Shriners International Annual Convention. As such, he represented the Shriners of the Upper Peninsula for more than 35 years. He was one of the Shriners International's longest serving Representatives of all time. Bob was a Charter Member of UP Court 180, Royal Order of Jesters, and served as its Director in 2009.

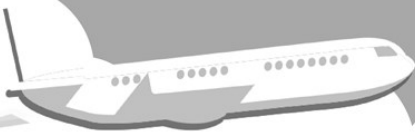
